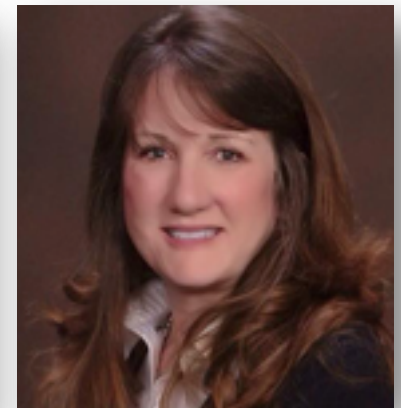

Indian Health Service Hospitals and BFHI

- Baby-Friendly launched at the Indian Health Service in 2011
- By 2015, 13/13 IHS hospitals were Baby-Friendly designated (~6% other hospitals nationally)
- All federal Navajo sites recently recertified!



Setting standards for the nation



COVID-19 has disproportionately affected American Indians and Alaska Natives

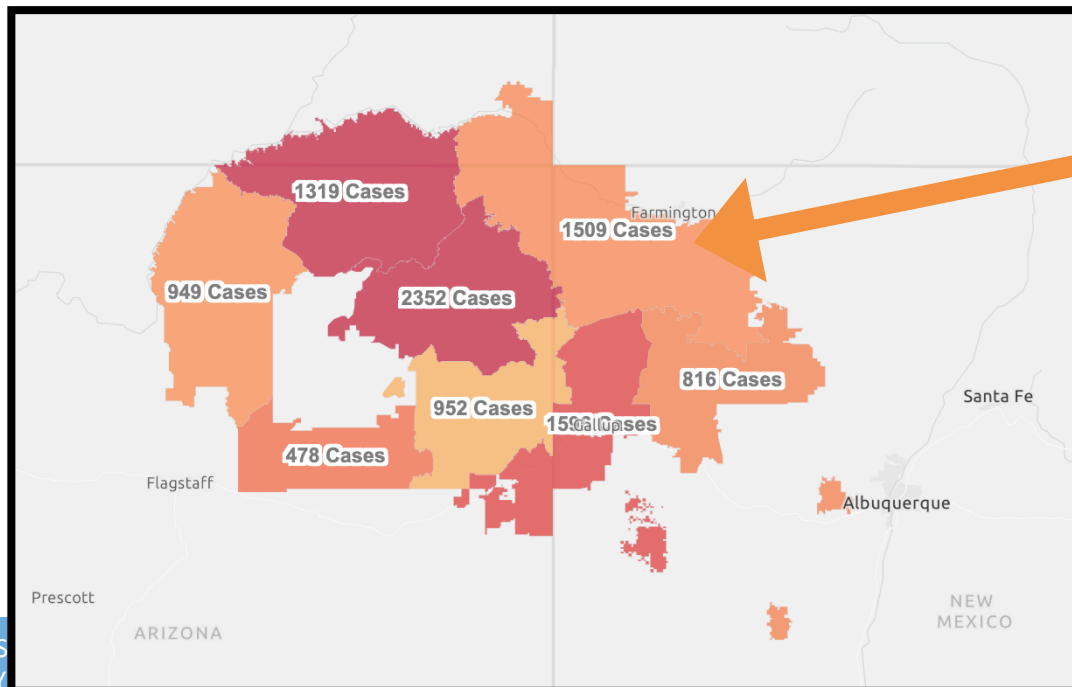
- AI/AN individuals make up 0.7% of the U.S. population, but 1.3% of COVID-19 cases reported to the CDC
- Other analyses have found COVID-19 cases to range from 2.7% to 4% in AI/AN
- AI/AN persons <65 years have been particularly affected

COVID-19 and the Navajo Nation

- On March 11, 2020, the Navajo Nation Commission on Emergency Management declared a public health state of emergency for the Navajo Nation
- In mid-May, the Navajo Nation surpassed New York and New Jersey for the highest per-capita infection rate in the U.S.

Navajo Nation COVID-19 Cases (as of September 12, 2020)

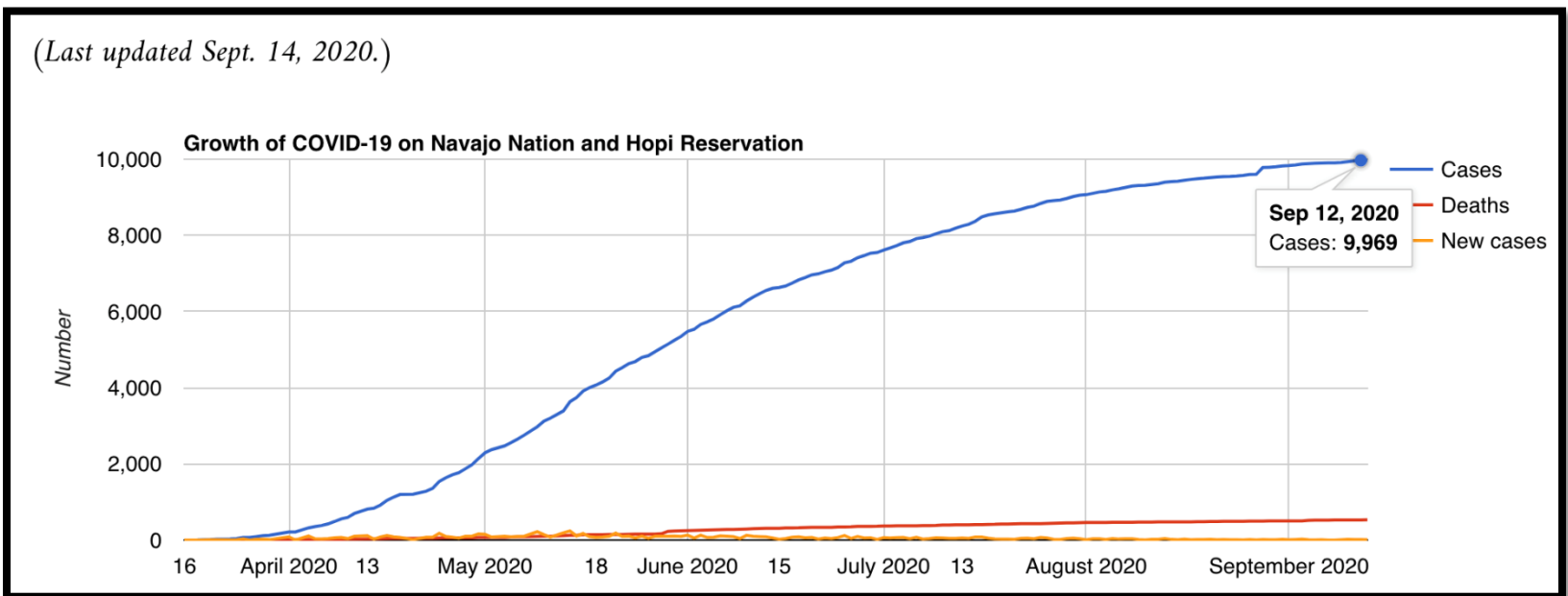


Shiprock Area:

COVID-19 and the Dine

- Cases on Navajo Nation peaked in May, with an average of 104 new cases per day
- In total, about 10,000 of the ~172,000 Dine living on and around the reservation have tested positive for COVID-19 and over 500 have died
