

Project Goal:

Reduce health disparities and rates of chronic disease among African Americans in Mississippi's three coastal counties of Hancock, Harrison, and Jackson



Strategy Areas











 Opened first Baby Café community breastfeeding resource at Singing River Health System in Pascagoula (Jackson County.)











- Since that time 2 additional Baby Cafés have been opened at Merit Health Hospital in Biloxi (Harrison County) and at The Gulf Coast Breastfeeding Center (Hancock County).
- With the onset of the pandemic, Baby Cafés have moved to a virtual platform and this has expanded their reach.





Other Breastfeeding Activities

- Coastal Family Health Center's Community Resource Manager provides referrals to clients based upon identified needs.
 - Can provide support to mothers through Baby Cafés and other resources.
- Jackson County Civic Action Committee Head Start sites were designated as breastfeeding friendly early childcare education centers.
 - Supports breastfeeding friendly environment for clients and employees
 - All 5 of their sites are now breastfeeding friendly.
- MSPHI supports implementation of the GO NAPSACC in early childhood education centers by offering a cash incentive for participation.
- MSPHI has also launched a communications campaign under the acronym of SHEA (Sharing Health Education and Awareness). It is a targeted, community-centered approach that focuses upon African American women and promotes messaging related to our strategies, which includes breastfeeding. https://sheahealth.org/


